	DRAMA Curriculum at TJA exposes the students to a wide range of theatrical styles and genres, so that pupils are able to develop and independently apply the skills of analysis, evaluation and devising. In KS3, a holistic approach has been taken so that students are afforded the opportunity to experience the all-encompassing role of a dramatist; knowledge and understanding are embedded alongside practical techniques and compounded through rigorous self-reflection and evaluation. The acquisitio of skill is cumulative and practical drama techniques are taught in line with relevant theory so that students recognize the relationship between the two aspects of the discipline. The topics chosen are designed to encourage empathetic engagement with greater social issues and develop a sense of creative conscience - 'Stone cold' and 'Boy in the dress' ; where they apply and further extend their practical tool kit when exploring monologues and duologues.
