In this edition we are looking at the events that have taken place through this Summer term as well as updating you on upcoming key dates and the term time calendar.

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
MESSAGE FROM HEAD OF SCHOOL

SCHOOL TRAVEL PLAN


As part of our School Travel Plan we continue to look at students' safety on their journeys to and from school.

Focusing on the school journey, students mapped their routes to school thinking about the energy they use and carbon footprint.





Every fornight we like to recognise students' efforts and praise their progress and achievement during an Achievement Assembly.


Students are awarded with certificates from the different teaching areas. We also send postcards home to let parents know that their child has received a certificate.
























SAFEGUARDING

As you are aware we provide breakfast free of charge every morning for all students who are on time. However, lunch needs to be paid for.

Lunch must be paid for termly IN ADVANCE, unless your child is entitled to free school meals.

Careers and interview support

In order to prepare our Year 10's for their work experience we provided a number of sessions prior to their placements. Intially we worked with students on interview skills and how best to answer questions and conduct themself in an interview. We held a Preparing for Opportunities day when students had to dress formally for an interview and we held mock interviews.





The National Citizenship Service also worked with our students, giving them CV writing tips and helping them to prepare for interviews.

Compass Workshop on Substance Misuse
