Focussing on harmful sexual behaviour, he has been educating students around the implications and serious consequences of using social media, in particular sharing images online.

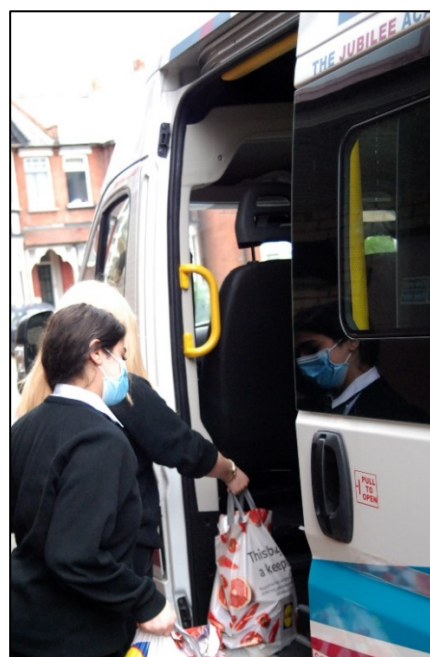
We have also looked at the subjects of consent and respect and how important this is, equipping students with the knowledge and encouraging them to speak up and be heard.

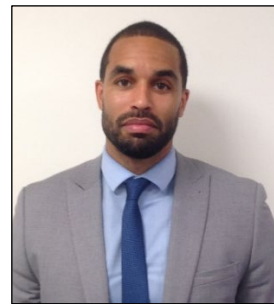

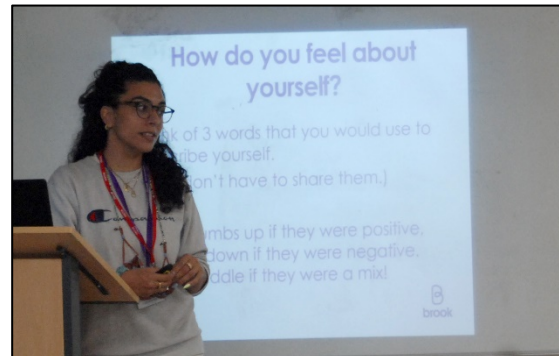
