Departments have led focussed assemblies and we have utilised RSHE to continue looking at important figures and stories of Black History.








We also ran a poster competition during RSHE and were really pleased with the fantastic artwork we received.




It was very hard to choose the winner; staff voted for their favourite poster.

The MAT programme is designed to target the Most Abled and Talented students within the school community.


The most abled students are students who are exceeding their targets in 3 or more subjects.
